# Celebrating 33 years of Service

ALBANY — Back in 1989 Albany resident Larry Hample opened the doors of his Residence Avenue home to the needy and the Albany Rescue Mission was born. Twenty-five years later, the organization still operates as a model of brother helping brother. Since its inception, those with the Rescue Mission have worked diligently through private donations to provide clothes, food and shelter to countless numbers of people needing assistance. Last year alone the mission served more than 85,000 free meals to the hungry. The mission serves two public meals a day, breakfast and lunch, and never turns anyone away. “We just let the Lord handle that part,” Hample said. “How do you turn someone down who needs help? That’s not our decision. ”Serving more than 7,000 meals a month, the Rescue Mission runs the largest feeding mission in the area, but its work doesn’t end there. In addition to serving meals to the needy, the mission also provides shelter to those willing to work a 12-week program that Hample believes will get residents back on their feet. Currently, the men’s program houses 45 men, while the women’s shelter houses 20 women and children. All who stay at the mission go through a Bible-based program designed to teach them that God loves them in spite of things that happened in their past. “We’re not just feeding people,” said Hample. “We’re giving them an opportunity to get their lives straightened out. When they come here, of course, they’ve got to make their peace with God and we give them that opportunity. We show them even though they’ve been beaten down, God loves them.”

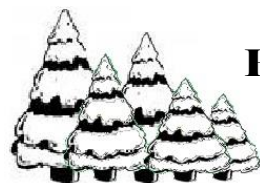

## STATEMENT OF SERVICE

### Who We Are

Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Every day, many homeless and needy men, women and children turn to the Albany Rescue Mission for help. We sincerely need *your* help! Since 1989, we have been providing for those in need by sharing food, shelter, and the Good News of the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. Our feeding program is extensive, **servng more than 7,000 meals each month. In addition to the 3 meals a day we serve to our residents, we also serve 2 meals a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, to anyone who comes.** We are a non-profit Christian Ministry that provides a long-term program for 45 Men, 20 Women, and children to get their lives back on track through the Lord Jesus Christ. Our 12 week provided program, consist of studying the Holy Bible (King James Version) and sharing that God loves us in spite of our sin nature. After the first 14 days the programmer is allow to seek employment. The Ministry covers all transportation and basic medical needs for anyone in the program. We have a relationship with Albany Area Mental Health Department, so those who require their services can receive the help they need free of charge. After the 12 weeks are over the programmer becomes a graduate and may choose to leave or volunteer as staff, or just simply stay as a graduate, if abiding by our rules of conduct.

Because of our strong Christian stand, **this ministry does not receive government funding**, and therefore, we rely on God’s provision through private donations and love offerings. We have our own publishing service on site. We produce books, CD’s, and DVD’s to help spread the Word of God. **We do not charge for any material that we publish.** We also maintain a website to spread the Word of God on a global level and provide insight to anyone who maybe curious about our organization.
